Background

The #Action4Inclusion initiative, launched in 2020, was conceptualised by Stellenbosch University's Student Representative Council, Prof Thuli Madonsela, SU's Law Trust Chair in Social Justice, Prof Sonia Human, former Dean of SU's Faculty of Law, and Social Justice Ambassadors. The funds raised via #Action4Inclusion are used to support students who cannot register for the next academic year owing to outstanding fees, as well as graduates who cannot access their academic records upon graduation, thereby hampering their capacity to contribute to a talented workforce.

Stellenbosch University firmly believes that no deserving student should be denied access to higher education based on their financial struggles. Stellenbosch University commits a substantial portion of its income - generated through state subsidies and student fees – to student bursaries each year. However, the University is experiencing increased financial strain as state subsidies for universities have progressively declined. Significant amounts of outstanding student debt further exacerbate our concerns as we cannot write off the money owed to the University because it is crucial to sustaining our operations.

Law Trust Chair in Social Justice

Since the inception of the #Action4Inclusion Campaign in 2020, it has been heartening to see students, parents, staff, alumni and members of the public come together to support one another as we work towards ensuring equal opportunities for all.

#Action4Inclusion is one of several initiatives that fall under Stellenbosch University's annual fund, Bridge the Gap, which enables the community to support our students and close the gap between talent and financial need – something we all care about.

The plight of students who are overwhelmed by university debt is of great concern. Many students from under-resourced backgrounds struggle to

pay their university fees and are at risk of dropping out or abandoning their studies when they are about to complete their degrees.

The problem of study debt primarily affects students from the so-called missing middle and students from poor working-class backgrounds that have fallen off the national student financial aid scheme (NSFAS) criteria, often for reasons beyond their control.

Through the **#Action4Inclusion** campaign we seek to ensure academic inclusion of all our students by helping them clear their debt.

I firmly believe that a lack of funding should not inhibit success and access to education should not be dependent on wealth. As a society, we have to make an effort to invest in social justice. It starts with giving a fair start to every child and every young person regardless of their race, gender and socioeconomic status. Inclusive development involves everyone and doesn't leave anyone behind.

Over the past two years, the **#Action4Inclusion** initiative has shown that young people are ready to take action and lead the way to ensure social justice becomes embedded in the fabric of our society. Helping students over the hurdle of university debt enhance young people's social mobility in pursuit of social justice while capitalising them as essential assets for sustainable economic growth and development.

Due to the hardships of the Covid-19 pandemic, there has been a drastic increase in the number of families who cannot afford university fees and many students have struggled to perform academically, which in turn has impacted their funding.

As a community, we are also still recovering from setbacks of the past two years, but I've been encouraged by the creative ways our **#Action4Inclusion** team has kept the momentum and focus on the goal of helping students. Our Social Justice Ambassadors' enthusiasm, resilience and integrity have made me proud to be part of this initiative.

The #Action4Inclusion Social Justice Walks and Mountain Hikes and live events such as the Comedy Night and Social Justice Café's have opened up meaningful ways to reach out to communities and connect with people who support our goals.

It is only with the support and collaboration of government, civil society, big business, academia, and every ordinary South African and global citizen, that we will be able to make the ideal of social justice a lived reality for everyone in South Africa.

Looking at the wonderful support for the **#Action4Inclusion** campaign, I am confident that social justice can become a reality in our country.



Project Vision

The strategy of **#Action4Inclusion** is linked to the Law Trust Chair in Social Justice's strategic vision of resource mobilisation through civil society. The strategy aims to leverage Prof Thuli Madonsela's brand by inviting stakeholders to join in the activities with her and to encourage donations to the campaign.

Goals & Objectives

- Clearing of student debt to ensure students are able to register and continue with their studies.
- Fundraising for future student fees to avoid accumulation of debt.

Beneficiaries

- We believe that all academically qualified students deserve to be able to register regardless of their race, gender and socio-economic status. During the past two years, **#Action4Inclusion** has assisted students from diverse backgrounds.
- During the 2020 registration period, a total student debt of **R1 337 779,68** was cleared.
- During 2021, a group of 17 students were uploaded on the Feenix platform, with an accumulated debt of R584 732,43. The Thuli Madonsela (ThuMa) Foundation, in collaboration with Anglo Ashanti, donated an amount of R114 804,88 to assist 9 students doing undergraduate programmes.
- In 2022, in partnership with the Student Debt Working Group and Stellenbosch University's Development and Alumni Relations Division, a total of **23** students were assisted with registration and/or accessing their academic records upon graduation.



- Prof Thuli Madonsela donated **R344 150,00** in her personal capacity in 2022.
- During 2022, donations from Stellenbosch University International, high-net-worth individuals and various other contributions were received to the amount of **R171 316,97**.
- In 2022 Ambassador Bridgette Radebe pledged an amount of **R161 274,21**.
- To date, a total of **97** students have been assisted through the project, in collaboration with our partners.

Activities

MOUNTAIN HIKES

Climbing with Prof Thuli Madonsela entails hiking significant mountains in the Western Cape and asking members of the public to join the walk for a fee/donation to **#Action4Inclusion**. The mountains already summited include Table Mountain, Coetzenburg's West Peak and the Dome of Helderberg Mountain.



The walks, in collaboration with **Visit Stellies**, is a scenic hike on an historic route from Stellenbosch to Pniel. The walk sheds light on the country's turbulent history and current social justice issues. It is widely attended by students, the public and high profile people such as the Premier of the Western Cape, representatives of the mayoral office and other dignitaries.

3 COMEDY NIGHT

The **#Action4Inclusion** comedy night was a live, hybrid (in person and virtual) event that took place on Friday 22 October 2021. The event was attended by SU staff and students with award-winning comedian Stuart Taylor being the star of the show.







4 R27 000 IN CELEBRATION OF 27 YEARS OF DEMOCRACY

In celebration of 27 years of democracy, Prof Thuli Madonsela donated **R27 000** to #Action4Inclusion and challenged all SU alumni, members of the public, companies, and captains of industry to give a 'democracy dividend' to young people striving to get a university qualification. Prof Madonsela was matched by SU's Chief Financial Officer, Prof Stan Du Plessis, SU alumnus Jean Meiring, Amanda Takis as well as an anonymous donor. In 2022, Prof Madonsela was again matched by Prof Stan Du Plessis, a member of the Council of Social Justice Champions and the Stellenbosch University Registrar's Responsibility Centre.

5 21 LIFE LESSONS @ 21

When Thembalethu Seyisi turned 21 in 2020, he decided to publish a book, 21 Life Lessons @ 21, to raise funds for good causes, including #Action4Inclusion. While still a third-year law student, Thembalethu approached 21 successful people he admires - some high-profile role models as well as personal heroes and family members - asking them to share one life lesson or insight they wish they'd known at 21. The result is a wonderful collection of stories by inspirational South Africans such as Justice Edwin Cameron, Prof Thuli Madonsela, Prof Kgethi Phakeng, Sello Hatang, Sandra Prinsloo, Khaya Sithole, Zelda la Grange, and many more. The book inspired an online series of interviews that appeared on the KKNK virtual platform.



Thembalethu Seyisi, who was awarded the Rector's Award for Excellence in Social Impact 2021, raised funds for **#Action4Inclusion** when he received his LLB degree in April 2022. The event was held at Middelvlei Wine Estate in Stellenbosch and raised **R10 000**.

In 2020 Prof Thuli Madonsela was honoured by the Vergelegen wine estate in Somerset West by adding a rose named after her to its rose garden as a Women's Month gesture. A portion of the sale of the Thuli Madonsela roses, sold at Ludwig's Roses, is donated to **#Action4Inclusion**.

1 FEENIX


Feenix was launched in June 2017 as a response to the #FeesMustFall movement that spread across campuses in South Africa in 2015 and 2016. Since its launch in 2017, over R80 million has been raised on the platform towards the student debt of more than 2 131 university students. In 2021, the **#Action4Inclusion** campaign partnered with Feenix to fundraise for 17 students.
